

Hello both! This takes about 15 minutes per tablet, and nothing you do can break anything. Any Samsung Galaxy tablet is fine. You only need WiFi for the set-up — at the show the app works with no internet at all.

WiFi: when the tablet asks for WiFi, connect it to the **office WiFi**. **Do not connect to the NETGEAR network yet** — that one is for the show.

Part 1 — Out of the box (brand-new tablet)

If the tablet is already set up and shows a normal home screen, skip this part and go straight to Part 2. For a brand-new tablet, the golden rule for the start-up questions is: **only the WiFi and the PIN matter — everything else can be skipped**.

1. Hold the **power button** until the Samsung logo appears, and give it a minute to start.
2. Choose **English**, tap **Start**, and accept the terms — you only need to tick the **required** boxes; optional “send data” boxes can stay unticked.
3. **WiFi screen:** this is the moment to connect — pick the **office WiFi** and enter its password. **Not NETGEAR**.
4. “Copy apps & data” or “Restore”: tap **Don't copy / Skip**.
5. Google sign-in: tap **Skip** — no account is needed. On the Google services screen just tap **Accept**.
6. **Screen lock:** choose **PIN** and set the **same simple PIN on every tablet** — write it down and share it with Marc. (You'll need it at the show to unlock the tablets.) If it offers fingerprint or face unlock, tap **Skip**.
7. Samsung account, assistants, extra apps, “protect your tablet”, software updates — tap **Skip / Not now / Later** on all of them.
8. When you reach the home screen, the tablet is ready — on to Part 2.

Part 2 — Install the app (once per tablet)

1. Check the tablet is on the **office WiFi** (done in Part 1). If it asks you to sign in to a Google account, tap **Skip** — it is not needed.
2. Open the tablet's **Camera** app and point it at the **square code below** — a link pops up on screen. **Tap it** and the download starts. That's all the code does: it saves you typing the long address.

If the camera doesn't offer a link, open **Chrome** and type this address instead:

3. The file starts downloading. It is big (about 1.3 GB) — a coffee-sized wait. If the tablet asks “keep file anyway?”, tap **Keep / Download anyway**.
4. When it finishes, tap the download notification to open it (or open the **Files** app → **Downloads** → tap the file ending in **.apk**).
5. The tablet will say it is *not allowed to install unknown apps* — this is normal. Tap **Settings** on that message, switch **Allow from this source** ON, press back, then tap **Install**.
6. When it says “App installed”, tap **Open**. You should see a dark screen with the Argenbright Group logo saying **GSX 2026 · Atlanta · 14–16 September**. That's it — the app is in.

Part 3 — Stations (nothing to set up!)

Every tablet carries all six stations. Visitors tap the screen, choose a station from the menu, and move between them freely — you don't need to configure anything. All the tablets are identical.

Part 4 — Lock it to the app (each morning of the show)

This stops visitors wandering out of the app. Android calls it “pinning”.

Turn pinning on (one-off, per tablet): open **Settings** → search for “**Pin**” → tap **Pin windows** (or “Pin app”) → switch it **ON**, and also switch on “**Ask for PIN before unpinning**” if offered.

Pin the app (each time):

1. Open the Argenbright GSX app.
2. Swipe up slowly from the bottom of the screen and hold — you'll see the app as a card with its icon at the top.
3. Tap the **icon** above the card and choose **Pin this app** (or “Pin”).
4. Done — the tablet now stays in the app. To unpin at the end of the day: swipe up from the bottom and **hold**, and enter the tablet's PIN if asked.

Part 5 — Daily checklist at the stand

1. Plug the tablets in — the screen stays on while the app runs, which uses battery.
2. Open the app and pin it (Part 4).
3. No WiFi needed — every video is inside the app.
4. If a tablet misbehaves: hold the power button, restart it, open the app again. That fixes almost everything.

Part 6 — The “Live from the UK” button

On the app's main screen there's a **Live from the UK** button. Tapping it starts a two-way video call with the team in England — visitors can see live demonstrations and talk to them. Two things to know:

1. It's the one part of the app that **needs WiFi** (everything else works offline).
2. The first time you tap it on each tablet, Android asks to allow the **camera** and **microphone** — tap **Allow** both times. Only do the call on one tablet at a time, or they'll squeal at each other.
